IMPORTANT REMINDER

Covid-19 Pandemic procedures are still in effect at Sacred Heart. Due to the overcrowding now, in the next couple of weeks we are going to start checking names at the door. (284-3811)

Last weekend less than 80 people called the office to sign up for 10:30 Mass and 232 showed up! This is way beyond our limit of 150-175 people! By calling ahead, you can help the staff & ushers prepare for more people to attend or we can direct you to a different Mass.

Please follow the following guidelines:

- Call the office before 3:00 on Friday. Do not leave a message after this time, as there will be no one here to add your name.
- Give the names of all who are attending Mass
- Follow social distancing guidelines and sit at least 6 feet away from people who are not in your family group.
- Masks must be worn at all times.

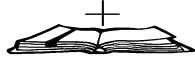
