PARISH MISSION

February 5-7. 2024

Our 2024 parish mission, presented by the Dominican Friars and Alumni of the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas - Angelicum in Rome, Italy, will help our parish to see the Presence of God in our lives. This mission, in particular, will provide a unique grace for everyone who participates. In order to receive this special grace, there will be daily opportunities for each and every person in attendance to go to confession.

The Lord is at work, but we frequently fail to see or even notice Him. The first day's theme is Divine Providence, the second day is about the Divine Indwelling (how the Lord lives in the tabernacle of our souls) and the third day is about His Real Presence in the gift of the holy Eucharist and the healing power of Jesus to transform all of us.



GRIEF





GOSPEL REFLECTION

"On the sabbath Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. The people were astonished at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority and not as the scribes." The religious experts, the scribes, are mentioned, though it seems they are not present, as a contrast to Jesus's authority. Perhaps they experts hung back, wary of how Jesus's teachings might affect their livelihood or authority, or because they disagreed that Jesus's authority was grounded in the Scriptures or God. Yet Jesus's final act in the Capernaum synagogue is the demonstration of the divine ground of his teaching authority. Jesus healed the man of the unclean spirit, and the people were again "amazed," referring to this action of Jesus as a "teaching": "[They] asked one another, 'What is this? A new teaching with authority.'" It is God's presence and power that is the lesson not only to learn but to encounter. Ultimately we are all students of the one teacher, whose authority is ordered to our salvation and joy. From this school we never graduate; this teacher is always guiding us. This education is perfected for our final purpose: to know God.

In the gospel we hear that the people of Capernaum "were astonished" at Jesus's teaching. What words of Jesus in the gospels do you find astonishing or even shocking? Living Liturgy for Extraordinary Ministers of the Holy Communion 2021
