

GOSPEL REFLECTION

To help Nicodemus understand his mystery and mission, Jesus reminds him of a story from the Hebrew Scriptures. God tells Moses to forge a bronze serpent, fix it and raise it up; if they gaze on it, they will be saved. This seems a great paradox: healing and life from gazing on a creature of death!

In our humanity, we are all bitten by death; yet, Jesus tells Nicodemus, the God who is love wants to give us life that never ends. And so the flesh of the Son of Man will be brutally, senselessly twisted around the wood of the cross, forged by the fire of his passion and death, and raised up for our salvation. In John's gospel, "raising" or "lifting up" always has the double sense of crucifixion and exaltation, death and resurrection, for the two movements are inseparable. The cross that will be raised up and venerated on Good Friday will give way at the Easter Vigil to the raised Easter candle, marked with the cross of fragrant "nails" of incense, from which we catch fire and rekindle our baptismal commitment to the saving and universal love of Jesus Christ.

In today's gospel, Jesus tells Nicodemus, "The light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light." Where do you perceive light encountering darkness in your community at this moment?



CHARITIES Camp I Am Special



For the past 41 years, Catholic Charities' Camp I Am Special (CIAS) has fostered and celebrated the quality of life for children, teenagers, and adults with intellectual and developmental differences. Our Campers come to us with a wide spectrum of disabilities to spend one week of summer like any other child would do, playing, swimming, laughing, and having all types of fun. CC provides this year 5 one-week camps: two day-camps and three residential camps. Buddies are volunteer high-school students paired 1:1 with Campers to provide around-the-clock care and companionship. Our Buddies receive training on all aspects of their Camper's differences, including needs and challenges as well as likes and dislikes. Buddies earn 121 service hours for a week of residential camp, 101 service hours for a week of day camp, 40 hours of service for MiniCamp and 6 hours of service for a Super Saturday. Buddies are expected to be selfless, dedicated, compassionate, energetic and fun.




